**Hope For Southall Street Homeless:** Thank you so much to the Young Adults of our parish and to all those who made last weeks Fundraising Event for Hope for Southall Street Homeless such a memorable event. £1,500 was raised.

**Preparing For Pentecost** Big events cry out for serious preparation. The coming royal wedding is an example. Closer to home for practising Christians is the feast of Pentecost, this Sunday just one week away. Originally Pentecost was an agricultural festival. Later the Jewish people used it to celebrate God's gift of the Law to Moses on Mount Sinai. For Christians, it is the feast celebrating the coming of the Holy Spirit. With Christmas and Easter, it is a pillar of our Christian belief.

We read in the Acts of the Apostles how after the Lord's Ascension into heaven the apostles returned to Jerusalem where 'all these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary, the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers' (Acts 1:14). What did they pray? Surely they were praying the prayer that Jesus had taught his disciples when they had asked him to teach them to pray. We know this prayer as the 'Our Father' (Luke 11:1-4). We find it after the parable of the good Samaritan and the story of Martha and Mary. Disciples of Jesus imitate the action of the Samaritan and listen to the words of Jesus as Mary did (Luke 10:29-52). They pray with Jesus. Matthew gives a longer version of this prayer in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 6:9-13).

But another prayer of Jesus can serve as a model for our prayer. We hear part of it in today's Sunday gospel. Jesus is praying to his Father. We pick out three intentions in his words. He prays first for unity among his followers. Unity is a major theme in John's gospel. The good shepherd is one who has 'other sheep not of this fold'. Jesus as the shepherd was the one who had to bring them in, so that 'there shall be one flock, one shepherd' (John 10:16). Jesus would die 'not for the nation only but to gather into one the dispersed children of God' (11:52).

Secondly, he prays for joy among his followers. Pope Francis in his new Apostolic Exhortation

(Gaudete et Exultate) reminds us that 'far from being timid, morose, acerbic or melancholy, or putting on a dreary face, the saints are joyful and full of good humour' (no. 122). Thirdly, Jesus asks his Father that his followers should be 'consecrated in the truth'. He prays for their holiness. God is holy. Jesus wants us to share in this holiness. Centuries before God had demanded of his people. 'You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy' (Leviticus 19:2). Pope Francis makes a similar call, quoting the Letter to the Ephesians. 'The Lord has chosen each of one of us "to be holy and blameless before him in love" [Ephesians 1:4]' (no.2).

Where is Jesus now? According to the New Testament, he is sitting at the right hand of God. 'God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Saviour' (Acts 5:31). He is 'in the bosom of the Father' (John 1:18). There he 'lives to make intercession' for us (Hebrews 7:25). He is our 'advocate with the Father' (1 John 2:1). He is praying for our unity, our joy and our holiness. Mary, the mother of Jesus, continues to pray the same prayer as we prepare with the apostles and all the saints for Pentecost.
