Lenten Alms 2018. This year's Lenten Alms will go to the Cardinal's Appeal which offers funding to new programmes of outreach across the Diocese that address some of today's more pressing problems here at home. The Appeal supports key areas of social outreach, young people and marriage and family life. The Cardinal's Appeal has very generously supported outreach work in St Anselm's Parish. This year it made grant of £45,000 to support the work of Hope for Southall Street Homeless and in Summer 2016 it gave a grant to cover the cost of our Parish Summer Youth Camp. We hope you will be as generous as you can. There will be a special collection for the Cardinal's Appeal on Sunday 11 March.

Lenten Lunch Sunday 11 March: We will be having soup and bread after the 11.30 am Mass, in the Parish Centre. What you would spend on your Sunday lunch at home, give to the Diocesan Lent Alms for the Cardinal's Appeal Fund. The funds raised will go to support parishes or groups in their work to further the mission of the church: to serve the evangelisation of youth, to develop marriage and family life projects, and to provide service in society, especially to those on the margins

You have to notify them by telling them that you are a Roman Catholic and that you would like the CHAPLAIN to know that you are in the hospital OR YOU CAN NOTIFY US DIRECTLY.

MARRIAGE PAPERWORK - Over the past few months a number of couples have come to the parish to complete their paperwork. A Gentle Reminder - you need to give 6 months notice of any marriage - whether it is taking place here or abroad in India, Philippines or elsewhere.

National Eucharistic Congress In Liverpool A National Eucharistic Congress, with the title Adoremus, will be held in Liverpool from Friday 7th to Sunday 9th September 2018. At the centre of the Congress will be Our Lord Himself in the Blessed Sacrament. The main speaker on Saturday 8th will be Bishop Robert Barron, known from his popular DVD series “Catholicism”. On Sunday 9th there will be an outdoor Procession of the Blessed Sacrament. Delegates can attend any one or more of the three days. There is a daily fee of £40. Since this is a national event, each parish has been allocated only a small number of tickets. We are asked to give names and details of delegates by 11th March. A Call To Young Adults - Your Bishops Want To Hear From You Cardinal Vincent Nichols and the Auxiliary Bishops of the Diocese are inviting Catholic young adults, aged 18 to 30, to meet with them to discuss the theme of the next Synod of Bishops – “Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment”. In particular, they would like to hear about how you see your place in the world, how faith impacts your life and how the Church can best accompany you as you work out God’s plan for your life. The Cardinal is hosting two meetings at Archbishop’s House in Victoria and the Auxiliary Bishops are hosting meetings across the diocese. You are invited to attend one of these meetings. They will involve discussion of the synod theme, an opportunity to question your bishops, and light refreshments.
