**The National Eucharistic Congress** The largest gathering of Catholics in England since Pope Benedict's visit in 2010 takes place in Liverpool September 8-9. We unite in worship of our Lord truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, with the aim of promoting Eucharistic Adoration, where so many people have experienced the love and presence of Christ. The Echo Arena in Liverpool - which can accommodate 10,000 pilgrims - will be the home to a six-hour stage programme on the 8th September and will include a Congress Mass, keynote speakers Bishop Robert Barron and Cardinal Vincent Nichols, and a drama highlighting the beauty of reverence and devotion. On the Sunday there are Masses in the Metropolitan Cathedral and a large outdoor Blessed Sacrament procession. Many other events and a Youth Congress will supplement the official programme. Thank you to those who kindly accepted the invitation to attend published earlier this year in the Newsletter. A party of ten from our parish including Father Gerard and Deacon Stephen will be attending the Congress.

"I am the Bread of Life" These words of Jesus taken from the Gospel are the central focus of the Eucharistic Congress 'Adoremus' that will be taking place in Liverpool in September. Eucharistic Congresses are gatherings of clergy, religious and laity and aim to promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Church. In

**YOUNG ADULTS OF ST ANSELM'S** meet every Sunday after 6:30 pm mass. Please do join us.

Liverpool participants will have the opportunity to hear talks about the Eucharist, as well as to spend time praying before the Blessed Sacrament, attending Mass and finally joining in a Blessed Sacrament Procession around the city.

This opportunity takes place in a different time to the last International Eucharistic Congress in England. This took place here in London in 1908 when permission for a public Blessed Sacrament Procession was refused due to it being too close to the Houses of Parliament. In response the participants had a huge procession without the Blessed Sacrament which ended with Benediction being given from the Balcony above the West Doors of Westminster Cathedral to thousands of people in the street below. The people of that time were aware of the new life that they received from the Eucharist and were determined to share this with their country in the wake of Catholic Emancipation and newly one freedom for Catholics to practise their faith. This great witness of faith in a city that was still suspicious and hostile to Catholicism is something that should inspire us and give us strength when we, too, face a negative attitude to our faith.

Let us pray that the Eucharistic Congress in September will be a time of renewal for those who attend and also for all our parishes. May we be inspired by the words and witness of those in Liverpool, so that we will make the Eucharist the source and summit of our lives and will trust that only through the bread that Christ gives us can we be given strength for our journey through life.

**Introduction to Pope's letter** On Monday of this week Pope Francis wrote a letter to the whole church about the sexual abuse crisis following shocking revelations from the United States, South America and elsewhere.

**Cardinal Vincent Nichols has written in response:** *"As a priest and bishop, I have found the last few weeks both shocking and distressing. The plain and detailed disclosure of the extent of the abuse of children which has taken place in various parts of our Church, over so many years, has been so painful to follow and to take to heart. Yet to do so is absolutely necessary.*

*The initial response of Pope Francis was that of 'sorrow and shame'. I fully share that response. I am so sorry for the hurt that has been caused, primarily to those whose lives have been radically damaged by childhood abuse, to their families, and to those who know personally a deep sense of trust that has been betrayed.*

*I am utterly ashamed that this evil has, for so long, found a place in our house, our Church. This evil has particular abhorrence because not only is it a terrible abuse of power, but also because, in its evil, it both employs and destroys the very goodness of faith and trust in God. As a Father in this House, I bear this shame in a direct way, for it is the direct responsibility of a father to protect his household from harm, no matter how difficult and complex that might be.*

*On Monday, Pope Francis, our Holy Father, addressed a letter to all members of the Church. Please urge your people to read it.*

*The Pope's Letter begins with a quotation from St Paul: 'If one member suffers, all suffer together with it' (1 Cor. 12.26). In doing so, he reflects on the ways in which we have paid insufficient attention to the suffering of those who have been abused, and on the ways in which we have to tackle this together, starting with the renewal of holiness which comes only with prayer and penitence.*

*Let us read this Letter over and over again. It has so much to give us."* The Popes Letter on the sexual abuse crisis is attached to this weeks newsletter.
