Mass Stipend Guidelines to Our Parishioners: Fr Gerard writes: Many people now make requests for Mass to be offered for their intentions e.g. for the repose of the soul of a deceased family member. As a result I regret it is no longer possible to accept long lists of requests as of December 2017, therefore, in order to be as fair as possible to everyone, the following change of procedure has been introduced: a limit of five intentions will be accepted and scheduled at any one time. (e.g. If a parishioner comes in with a request of 10 intentions, we can accept all 10, but only 5 will be scheduled within the parish when openings are available and the other 5 will be sent to the Missions to be said.) If for any unforeseen circumstance, such as a funeral, a Mass cancellation occurs the intention for that Mass will be rescheduled to the next available opening.

For many years the Diocesan guideline has been that a Mass stipend should be £10, but at St Anselm's the suggestion is that you make whatever offering you can afford and for some that may be £5. However, any Mass that is sent to the Missions requires the £10 stipend.

When a priest accepts a Mass stipend, he contracts with the person to pray for the intention at a specific Mass, that does not, nor can it, preclude him from also praying for other intentions as well. Every person present, including the priest, & all celebrants, may, & hopefully will, not only pray for their own intentions at Mass, but also for the intentions of all present, as well as for the needs of our world, Church, & local community. Each of the Eucharistic prayers have within them prayer for many intentions - the Prayer of the Faithful does likewise. Therefore, the Mass is never offered for a single intention.
