**REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY** 11 November 2018 10.45 a.m. at Memorial to the War Dead at Manor House Gardens on the Green 2 minute silence at 11 a.m. followed by Procession to St John's Church, Church Avenue, Southall for Civic Service followed by refreshments. All are welcome

Remembrance Sunday is held in the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth of Nations as a day "to commemorate the contribution of British and Commonwealth military and civilian servicemen and women in the two World Wars and later conflicts". It is held on the second Sunday in November, the Sunday nearest to 11 November, Armistice Day, the anniversary of the end of hostilities in the First World War at 11 a.m. in 1918.

Across The United Kingdom, Remembrance Sunday is marked by ceremonies at local war memorials in most cities, towns and villages,

Two minutes' silence is held at 11 a.m., before the laying of the wreaths. The silence represents the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918, when the guns of Europe fell silent. This silence is started by the buglers sounding the Last Post and ended by the buglers sounding The Rouse.

Almost 10 million military personnel lost their lives as a result of the First World War. There were 9 million civilian deaths, added to this there were 20 million people who sustained serious or life changing injuries. Today we remember and pray for them all.

On Remembrance Sunday the memorial to all those from our parish who gave their lives in the World Wars is placed before the altar and poppies are displayed on the sanctuary

**We will Remember them** One of the ways to be a peacemaker is to help the victims of war and violence. As the weather gets colder, the need for safe accommodation for Refugees is more urgent. The Jesuit Refugee Service welcomes refugees to their centre in Wapping. They are holding an 'open evening' for their hosting scheme, by which destitute asylum seekers are hosted by members of the community in London, on a three- month basis. This is an opportunity to hear a presentation on the process of hosting through JRS, to ask any questions you may have on becoming a host, and also to hear from a host whom has had several guests through At Home. This is an open, no-pressure evening in which all questions are welcomed. If you have a spare room in London, and would consider opening your home to provide a warm and welcoming environment to a destitute asylum seeker, please do come along. The meeting will be 6.30- 7.30pm (arrivals from 6pm) on Tuesday 27th November, at our centre in Wapping: Hurtado Jesuit Centre, 2 Chandler Street, London, E1W 2QT. Refreshments will be provided. **Growing in generosity on the World Day of the Poor** by Sr Silvana Dallanegra RSCJ 'Let us love not in word or speech, but in deed and in truth' (1 John 3:18).

With these words Pope Francis launched the first World Day of the Poor last year. To be kept annually on the 33rd Sunday of the liturgical year (which this year falls on the 18th November), this is an opportunity for us all to bear witness to Jesus' love for the poor and vulnerable among us, through focused prayer and almsgiving or some service.

By now, our shops are full of Christmas gifts, food and drink; our screens bombard us with enticing adverts; and plans for parties, family get-togethers and festive meals are in full swing. Coming in the midst of all this, World Day of the Poor invites us to remember a different reality: that of hardship and deprivation, and the poverty that comes from loneliness. It also reminds us that next month we will celebrate God's Incarnation as a helpless baby, born in a makeshift shelter, in poverty and insecurity. If for no other reason World Day of the Poor is important because it keeps us anchored in these realities, and gives us the opportunity to pause, take stock and offer something of ourselves in prayer and service.

In his letter for this year's World Day Pope Francis acknowledged this, saying that last year: 'Many people encountered the warmth of a home, the joy of a festive meal and the solidarity of those who wished to sit together at table in simplicity and fraternity. I would like this year's, and all future World Days, to be celebrated in a spirit of joy at the rediscovery of our capacity for togetherness.'

Caritas Westminster is inviting parishes, schools and other Catholic communities to pray, discern and find ways to put their faith and love into action, on or around this World Day. For some this might mean supporting a local foodbank or other project, for others a collection or event to raise funds for a charity such as Mary's Meals, or something which enables people to reach out to those around them who are poor, lonely or vulnerable. However we mark this and future World Days of the Poor, we hope it will enable us all to grow in awareness, generosity and an active love. In the words of Pope Francis: 'On this day, may all of us feel that we are in debt to the poor, because, in hands outstretched to one another, a salvific encounter can take place to strengthen our faith, inspire our charity and enable our hope to advance securely on our path towards the Lord who is to come.'
