Message from Father Gerard At soon as flights to India resume Father Tharyiam will be leaving us to return to India, though if passenger flights to India have not begun by that stage he will be with us a little longer. . We wish him well as he returns home and will keep him in our prayers.

I also shall be saying farewell to St Anselm's later on this summer. Father Jovito F. D'Souza, SJ has been appointed Parish Priest by the Jesuit Provincial. He has been serving as Vocations Promoter for the Society of Jesus in the Jesuit Province in Goa and Director of Xavier Retreat House. Fr Jovito spent two weeks visting the parish last November. He will arrive later this summer though we cannot be sure when because of present travel restrictions. I will be with him for a month after his arrival in the parish and then he will take over as Parish Priest.

Fr Jovito will be assisted by Father Eddy Bermingham, SJ who has worked in Guyana and Trinidad over the years. He now lives in St Ignatius Parish Stamford Hill and has helped to develop a new MA in Theology, Ecology and Ethics at the London Jesuit Centre

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION: After the prayer and its response "Behold the Lamb of God...Lord I am not worthy," the priest holds up the Host to the Congregation and say audibly "The Body of Christ" to which the people should respond "Amen."

Then the priest holds up the chalice and says, "The Blood of Christ" and again the people respond "Amen."

The priest receives Holy Communion under both kinds using his own Host and Chalice.

The Priest gives the Blessing and Dismissal - "Go in peace glorifying the Lord by your life"

Holy Communion will be distributed at the end of Mass.

People should wait in their pews until instructed to move forward to the priest or minister for Holy Communion by the Stewards, always aware of the regulations on social distancing in the orderly queue.

Communion must be given silently in the hand only, with the communicant standing, avoiding any physical contact.

When communicants approach the Priest or Minister, they should do so with arms at "full stretch" so that there is a good distance between the Priest or Minister and the communicant.

Their hands, palms upwards, one of top of the other, should be extended as flatly as possible.

Having received Holy Communion, communicants should leave the church straight away and make their thanksgiving on the way home.

The Church is locked after the last communicants leave.

The Church will not be open for private prayer on Saturday or Sunday.

The church will continue to be opened for private prayer Monday-Friday 10 a.m.-12 noon

'Going to Hospital' The Hospital Chaplain used to have access to the list of patients on a ward. That is no longer the case and either the person themselves or family or friends must let the Chaplain know if you would like a visit or Communion.

The Church will be open every day Monday to Friday from 10a.m. - 12 Noon. This is for private prayer only. Father Thayriam or Fr Gerard will be in the Baptistry every day during the time when the church is open if anyone wants a socialdistanced confession or a chat. We will continue broadcasting the Mass each morning and will have Evening Prayer as we have been doing.

Please also note that:

* Only 20 people will be allowed into the Church at any one time and we ask that you do not stay for a long time so as to allow others the opportunity to enter.

* The toilets will not be open to the public at this time.

* The Repository, the Rectory and the Parish Office and the Sacristy will remain closed.

Father Gerard writes: Children's Liturgy To help us during this time when the church is closed, a new Sunday Liturgy for families with young children has been created by Al and Pearl Johnson. They are parents of two young boys in our parish. I do very warmly recommend it to you. There will be a short children's liturgy every Sunday focussing on the key message of the Gospel Reading to encourage the children of our parish to participate more fully in the Eucharistic celebration. We hope that it will be a valuable time of prayer and formation for families. Confirmation Preparation Programme Because of the Covid19 crisis the Bishops were not be able to come to many parishes to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. The Bishops have given permission and delegated Parish Priests to confirm candidates this year.

Now that the church is open for Mass and gatherings we may conclude the Confirmation Preparation Programme Sessions will be held in the church. Young people and catechists must wear a mask at all times and be socially distanced.

Classes will begin at 5 p.m. and finish by 6 p.m.

Young people must arrive at the church at least 20 minutes before the class starts. Classes will start at 5 p.m. sharp when the doors of the church will be locked and latecomers will not be able to enter.

The Monday Group Meetings will begin on 3 August. The Tuesday Group Meetings will begin on 4 August.

Do you like KitKats? Then I want to draw your attention to this. Nestlé announced their KitKats in the UK and Ireland will no longer be Fairtrade. About 27,000 cocoa and sugar farmers are set to miss out on annual premiums worth £1.6m after Nestlé announced their KitKats in the UK and Ireland will no longer be Fairtrade. From October, the cocoa for KitKats will come from the same farms under Nestlé's own cocoa sustainability programme, Cocoa Plan, certified with the Rainforest Alliance while the sugar will mainly come from the UK, with some sourced from France.
