A Prayer On The Death Of His Royal Highness The Duke Of Edinburgh: *God of our lives, we give thanks for the life of Prince Philip, for his love of our country, and for his devotion to duty. We entrust him now to your love and mercy, through our Redeemer Jesus Christ. Amen.*

On Friday 9th April, the death of Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh was announced. Following the sad news, Cardinal Vincent offered prayers for the repose of his soul:

‘At this moment of sadness and loss I pray for the repose of the soul of Prince Philip, Her Majesty the Queen’s faithful and loyal husband. I pray for the Queen and all of the Royal Family. ‘How much we will miss Prince Philip’s presence and character, so full of life and vigour. He has been an example of steadfast loyalty and duty cheerfully given. May he rest in peace.’

Divine Mercy Sunday: The Divine Mercy is a devotion to Our Lord associated with the apparitions of Jesus to Saint Faustina Kowalska. The venerated image under this Christological title refers to what St Faustina’s diary describes as “God’s loving mercy” towards all people, especially for sinners. St. Faustina was granted the title “Secretary of Mercy” by the Holy See in the Jubilee Year of 2000. St Faustina reported a number of apparitions during religious ecstasy which she wrote in her 1934-1938 diary, later published as the book *Diary: Divine Mercy in My Soul*.

The two main themes of the devotion are to trust in Christ’s endless goodness, and to show mercy to others acting as a conduit for God’s love towards them.

Stand With Stan: Fr Stan Swamy, the Indian Jesuit human rights’ activist, has now been imprisoned for six months. An application for bail was recently refused. Jesuit Missions are using the occasion of his 84th birthday on 26th April to continue to draw attention to his case. Paul Chitnis, Director of Jesuit Missions writes:

I am writing to invite you and your parish community to support an urgent action in solidarity with the imprisoned Indian Jesuit, Fr Stan Swamy SJ who celebrates his 84th birthday on 26 April.

Fr Stan was imprisoned last October on baseless terrorist charges which he vehemently denies. He has now spent over 180 days, including Christmas and Easter, behind bars in Taloja prison in Mumbai.

An international campaign – **Stand with Stan** - has attracted huge support. In Britain, politicians of all parties have raised his situation in Parliament. The Provincial, Fr Damian Howard SJ, participated in a demonstration outside the High Commission of India last year and has also co-signed a letter to the media with Cardinal Vincent Nicholls calling for Fr Stan to be bailed.

Shortly before Easter, a bail application to secure Fr Stan's release because of his age and infirmity (he has Parkinson's disease) was rejected by the Indian courts.

A statement from the Curia in Rome strongly condemned the decision of the Court and said:

“We stand united with Stan and many other human rights defenders at this crucial juncture. We commit ourselves to continue our effort, both nationally and internationally, to bring truth and justice to light and advocate for the rights of vulnerable people in a peaceful, non-violent way.”

You are invited to send Fr Stan a birthday or Easter greeting expressing your solidarity with him.

The card can be very simple; a postcard or even a piece of folded paper.

We intend to present the cards to the Indian High Commissioner on Fr Swamy's birthday.

Please note that it would be great to get as many individually signed cards from members of your parish community as possible. We want the volume of cards presented to the High Commissioner to be as large as possible.

Fr Stan has devoted his life to working for the poorest and most marginalised people in India. The Indian government has pursued a campaign of harassment against Fr Stan and other human rights activists in recent years. As Fr Stan said in a video message recorded just two days before his arrest:

“What is happening to me is not something unique or happening to me alone. It is a broader process that is taking place all over the country... I am happy to be part of this process because I am not a silent spectator but part of a game and ready to pay the price for it, whatever be it.”

Fr Stan embodies the Christian ideal of service and sacrifice. Please join us in sending him a message of hope and solidarity this Easter.

London Citizens Mayoral Assembly, 6-7.30 p.m., Wednesday 28 April Fr Gerard writes: Thank you very much to all those many members of the parish who kindly signed our parish citizens petition to the Mayor of London calling for the creation of 60,000 new green jobs in London. So far 737 people have signed our petition.

I should now like to ask for your further help in promoting our campaign. In three weeks time on Wednesday 28 April there will be a large and important meeting, the London Citizens Mayoral Assembly, with Shaun Bailey and Sadiq Khan who are standing in the election on May 6th for the next Mayor of London.

At the meeting they will be challenged to make a public commitment to create the 60,000 new jobs. It is a very important meeting, the largest public meeting before the election and we are asking for 90 minutes of your time to support our campaign.

100 places are available for members of St Anselm's Parish and so far 11 people have signed up. Please do join us on Wednesday 28 April from 6 -7.30 p.m. It is very easy to register for the meeting. Donating Online: You can still continue to support the parish by donating online. In order to do this please use the Donate button on the parish website which will take you to a secure Virgin Money Giving donation form. You can donate either with a credit/debit card or a PayPal account. If you are a UK taxpayer you can add 25p to every £1 that you give through Gift Aid. If you are donating by Virgin Money, please tick the Gift Aid box as you make your donation. Contrary to what is often wrongly assumed, we do not receive any financial support either from the Vatican nor from the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Westminster of which the Saint Anselm's parish is a part, and at whose request the parish is run by the Fathers of the Society of Jesus. Together with all

other parishes in Westminster Diocese we also make an annual financial contribution, according to our means, to the running of the diocese and its various public charities.

Settlement Scheme for European Citizens: EU, EEA and Swiss citizens who were living in the UK by 31st December 2020 have until 30th June 2021 to apply for the Settlement Scheme. Those who do not apply are at risk of losing their rights to live and work here or access important services such as healthcare.
